Key Leadership Lessons:

1. Anyone can be an authoritarian, command and control, leader because it aligns with human nature. It's easy. Leaders who make this their default approach to leadership want what they want, want it now, and often want it at any cost. Be an exceptional leader whose approach is to add value to organizations and make a positive difference in people's lives. Evaluate your motives and priorities.
2. Leadership and management are not synonymous. The mindset is different between leadership and management, so is the focus, and so are the competencies. They are two separate things.
3. Leadership starts with you. If you want to become an exceptional leader you must take responsibility for your growth and development.
4. Leader development is human development. They are one and the same

Bonus Leadership Lessons:

1. Rather than zero sum thinking, be a leader who seek mutually beneficial "win-win" strategies and seeks to do right by all people—not just yourself or a few.

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Bonus Leadership Lessons Continued:

2. Toxic leadership is a character problem, not a personality problem. Be a leader who values others and doing right by all people!
3. Culture reflects leadership. Be a leader who sets, models, and upholds standards.
4. Be a leader first and focus on building your leadership capacity, then develop management skills.
5. We must accept that effective leadership is hard because it is complex, ambiguous, uncertain, full of opposition and adversity, and there are no quick fixes. It requires qualities like fortitude, perseverance, commitment, and dedication. It requires competence in specific things, and it requires the capacity to keep learning and growing. Exceptional leaders get this.
